After deliberations, the Authority directs to adjourn and place the matter before it in its next meeting along with detail report, for consideration.

Item No. 15(a): To consider and decide on the letter No. 10/ADM/एडीएम/ पदविका/ २०१७/३९३७, dated 26-09-2017 submitted by Director, Technical Education, Mumbai regarding the Non-uploading of admissions by institutes within stipulated time duration.

And

Item No. 15(b): To consider and decide on the letter No. 2A/ADM/2017/ ११५६, dated 04-10-2017 submitted by Director, Technical Education, Mumbai to permit the institutes with imposing appropriate penalty to upload the admission details w.r.t. those who have not uploaded the same within stipulated time duration.

The Authority perused the aforesaid letters received from Director, Technical Education, Mumbai to permit the institutes with imposing appropriate penalty to upload the admission details w.r.t. those who have not uploaded the same on the DTE's portal within stipulated time duration. The Director vide letters dated 26-09-2017 and 04-10-2017 proposed to permit the Government and Unaided Diploma Engineering/Pharmacy/HMCT Colleges to upload the admissions details.

It is made clear that permission for approval of admission in the Government/Government Aided Colleges/Institutes is not within the purview of the Authority.

The Unaided Private Colleges/Institutes have not submitted the admission details of the students online in DTE's portal within stipulated time, who have been allotted in CAP rounds. Such mistakes were done by some Colleges/Institutes for Academic Year 2016-17.

The Authority went through the decision taken in its meeting held on  $19^{th}$  October 2016 at Item No. 12 and  $9^{th}$  November 2016 at Item No. 10(b), in similar case. It is observed that the various Unaided Colleges/Institutes repeated these mistakes in Academic Year 2017-18.

The Institutes have not submitted the admission details of the students online in DTE's portal within stipulated time. Such type of mistake was done by some Colleges/Institutes for Academic Year 2016-17.

The Authority went through the decision taken in its meeting held on 19<sup>th</sup> October 2016 at Item No. 12 and 9<sup>th</sup> November 2016 at Item No. 10(b), in similar case. It is observed that the various Unaided Colleges/Institutes repeated this mistake in Academic Year 2017-18.

After deliberations, in view of the above and in the interest of the student, the Authority decides to permit to upload the admission details of the student viz. Ku. Raj Vinayak Waghmare online in DTE's portal, subject to following conditions:-

After receipt of the same it may be placed before the Authority for its consideration. Office to inform accordingly.

Item No. 18: <u>To discuss and decide on the issues related with provisions of Government Resolution bearingno.</u> मातंसं-०८८/२७/२०१६ – DIR IT (MH), dated 19-09-2017.

The Authority already decided at Item No. 12, above.

Item No. 19: To consider and decide on the following matters with the permission of the Chair.

Item No. 19(a): To accumulate amount/fund of the State CET-CELL for period of five years from 31-03-2017 to acquire building/immovable property and other infrastructure of the Authority and to avail Income Tax benefits.

The office of the Commissioner State CET Cell submitted that the Chartered Accountant of State CET Cell forwarded an important note of the subject matter to be immediately put before the Hon'ble Members of the Authority for resolution. As per the note it is submitted that State CET Cell is registered under section 12AA of Income Tax Act, 1961. Under Section 11(1) of the Act, 15% of gross receipts of the CET Cell are exempt. Under section 11 (2), in addition to exemption under section 11(1), the CET Cell can accumulate an amount for five years and the same accumulated amount will not be taxable. However, the amount has to be utilized within five years for achieving objects of the CET Cell. It is further submitted that as per the Provisional accounts for the period ended 31/03/2017, an amount of Rs.50 Crores can be accumulated under section 11(2) and subject to utilization of the amount before 31/03/2022, the State CET Cell office can save Tax on the same. The objects of the State CET Cell can be achieved better, if the CET Cell has an independent office to house the officers, Staff and other Stake holders and resolution of the Authority to that effect is required to be passed.



In view of these, after deliberations, the Authority resolves that an amount of Rs. 50 Crores or the appropriate amount to be accumulated for the period of five years from 31/03/2017 to be spent for conducting examination and allied activities thereto, constructing/ acquiring building, immovable property and/or other infrastructure for facilitating performance of objects of the State CET Cell. The Commissioner, State CET Cell is authorize to communicate with the Income Tax department in this regard. Office of the State CET-CELL to take necessary steps.

Item No. 19(b):

To consider and decide on the letter dated September 2017 received from the Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai regarding late declaration of results of the students admitted at Institute level for MBA course in GNVS Institute of Management, Mumbai for the Academic Year 2016-17

The Authority further directs the GNVS Institute of Management, Mumbai to submit their admission details online and the proposal for approval of admissions to the Authority. Office to inform accordingly.
