Attention is drawn to the mandate of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Petition No. (2003) 6 Supreme Court cases 697 Islamic Academy of Education v/s. State of Karnataka, Para. No. 16 as re-produced hereunder:

"We thus hold that the management could select students, of their quota, either on the basis of the common entrance test conducted by the State or on the basis of a common entrance test to be conducted by an association of all colleges of a particular type in that State e.g. medical, engineering or technical etc. The common entrance test, held by the association must be for admission to all colleges of that type in the state. The option of choosing, between either of these tests, must be exercised before issuing of prospectus and after intimation to the concerned authority and the committee set up hereinafter. If any professional college choose not to admit from the common entrance

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(List attached - Annexure-C)

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<u>test conducted by the association then that college must necessarily admit from the</u> <u>common entrance test conducted by the State.</u> After holding the common entrance test and declaration of results the merit list will immediately be placed on the notice board of the colleges which have chosen to admit as per this test. A copy of the merit list will also be forthwith sent to the concerned authority and the committee. Selection of students must then be strictly on the basis of merit as per that merit list." (emphasis supplied)

Authority perused observations of the Director, Technical Education, Mumbai and also noticed that the admissions have been done in those Colleges/Institutes through more than one CET. Director, Technical Education, Mumbai found certain discrepancies in admission process of **181** colleges/institutes done through MHCET-2015 only. Authority after deliberation decides to approve eligibility and selection process of following **181** colleges/institutes in Technical Education for Academic Year 2015-16 of MHCET-2015 students only, subject to the Director, Technical Education sorting out and disposing off with the said discrepancies after appropriate compliances from respective Colleges/Institutes for Academic Year 2015-16, within four weeks.
