The Authority went through the decision taken by the Authority in its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2017 at Item No. 4.

The Authority as per the Order dated 15<sup>th</sup> December, 2016 of Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Bombay in W.P. no.s 13015 of 2016 and similar/clubbed petitions gave hearing to the following representatives.

Adv. V.M. Thorat submitted that he is representing the Association of Management of Ayurvedic Colleges of Maharashtra as well as the Petitioner Ayurvedic Colleges/Institutes.

Adv. V. M. Thorat submitted on behalf of the Association and the Ayurvedic colleges that vital and serious issues of seats going waste every year due to unavailability of candidates passing Common Entrance Test and becoming eligible and also because of the Rule of Domicile i.e. the outside State students are prohibited from appearing in the said Common Entrance Test. With respect to PG Ayurveda admissions of Academic Year 2015-16 the Association decided to hold Common Entrance Test and to conduct 2 rounds of admissions and vacancies at the end of second round to be reverted to the respective colleges for being filled in at the Institute level by holding Common Entrance Test of 100 Marks and submitted it to then Pravesh Niyantran Samiti for approval.

Adv. V.M. Thorat also submitted that member Colleges of the Association of Management of Ayurvedic Colleges of Maharashtra have followed the Rules of the brochure of APGA-CET-2015, which was approved by the earlier Pravesh Niyantran Samiti for conducting College level CET for the admissions to Post Graduate Ayurved Courses for the Academic Year 2015-16. The Authority asked to produce the Rules/brochure of APGA-CET-2015, approved by the then Pravesh Niyantran Samiti.

Adv. V.M.Thorat could not produce the copy of Rules/brochure approved by the Samiti, and also the Court Judgments he was relying upon but requested to give some time to produce it to the Authority.

It is noticed that the Association of Management of Ayurvedic Colleges of Maharashtra had conducted the APGA-CET-2015 for admissions to Post Graduate Ayurved Courses for the Academic Year 2015-16. It is binding on the member Colleges/Institutes of the aforesaid Association to admit the students and complete the admission process only on the basis of APGA-CET-2015. However it is seen that various Colleges/Institutes had conducted their own CET's at Institute level, for filling up remaining vacancies, which was against the set procedure.

The Authority went through the decisions taken by the then Pravesh Niyantran Samiti/ Admissions Regulating Authority in its meeting held on 11/08/2015, 13/04/2016, 08/06/2016 and 27/07/2016.

After deliberations, the Authority acceded to the request made by the Adv. Thorat on behalf of Association and Colleges/Institutes to remain present along with all necessary documents/papers/judgments before the Authority in the next meeting. The Authority directed Adv. Thorat to submit the Vakalatnama in this regard. Office to inform accordingly.

## Item No. 3(b): The Annsaheb Dange Ayurved College, Ashta, sangli, ref.:- Minutes of the Meeting dated 12/07/2017 at Item No. 3.

The Authority went through the decision taken by the Admissions Regulating Authority in its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2017 at Item No. 3.

The Authority heard Vd. Vinay Nikam, Vice Principal and Mr. Nitin Shah, Administrative Officer on behalf of the College/Institute. The college has admitted 25 Candidates through college level CET for the PG Ayurved for Academic Year 2016-17. The Authority in its meeting dated 4/05/2017 disapproved the admissions of 25 Candidates admitted through college level CET and hence the Institute filed Writ Petition before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Mumbai vide WP(st) No. 19284/2017 and so the matter is subjudice.

In view of the above, after deliberations, the Authority feels that, no action is necessary at this stage as the matter is subjudice. The Authority directs to the aforesaid College/Institute to submit the final judgment in the said matter to the Authority. After receipt of the same it may be placed before the Authority for its consideration. Office to inform accordingly.

# <u>Item No. 3(c)</u>: <u>The K.R. Pandav College of Physiotherapy, Nagpur, ref.:- Minutes of the Meeting dated 12/07/2017 at Item No. 3.</u>

The Authority went through the decision taken by the Admissions Regulating Authority in its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2017 at Item No. 3.

The Authority heard Mr. Kiran Pandav on behalf of the College/Institute.

The representative of the College submitted that the college has got affiliation from Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik on 18/10/2016 and the Cut-off-date for the admission of B.P.Th. for Academic Year 2016-17 was 30/10/2016. Due to short of time and lack of knowledge of admission procedure College/Institute admitted 23 students at Institute level in First Year B.P.Th. course for the Academic Year 2016-17 without prior permission of Admissions Regulating Authority. The college representative submitted that the college is ready to pay the fine, if any, imposed by Authority and requested to regularize the admissions of such candidates.

In view of the above, after deliberations, as a one-time measure and in the interest of the students and taking into consideration of their academic loss, the Authority decides to approve the admissions of admitted students of K.R. Pandav College of Physiotherapy, Nagpur for First Year B.P.Th. course for the Academic Year 2016-17, *subject to payment of penalty of Rs. 50,000/- per candidate* and compliance of eligibility Rules laid down by respective Authorities. The Authority further directs that the said permission is granted only for the Academic Year 2016-17 and the College/Institute should not treat it as a precedent for the years to come.

The amount of penalty shall be paid by the Institution within a period of two weeks from the date of publication of these minutes on the official website of the Authority. The Authority directs the College/Institute that payment should be paid in the form of Demand Draft / Pay order in favour of "THE SECRETARY, ADMISSIONS REGULATING AUTHORITY, MUMBAI", payble at Mumbai.

Office to inform accordingly.

#### <u>Item No. 3(d)</u>: <u>The Sai Homoeopathic College, Bhivandi, Thane, ref.:-</u> <u>Minutes of the Meeting dated 12/07/2017 at Item No. 3.</u>

The Authority decides to give hearing to the aforesaid College/Institute in its next meeting. Office to inform accordingly.

#### Item No. 4:

To discuss and decide on the verification/observation report submitted by the Directorate of Medical Education and Research, Mumbai regarding Post Graduate and Under Graduate Courses for the Academic Year 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18.

The Authority perused the observation reports dated 20/01/2017, 19/06/2017, 04/07/2017, 14/07/2017 and 26/07/2017 submitted by the Directorate of Medical Education and Research, Mumbai in respect of admission process of Heath Science Courses (UG/PG) for the Academic Year 2015-16 (MD/MS – 01), 2016-17 (M.P.Th. – 05, BDS - 01 & B.Sc. - 03)) and 2017-18 (MD/MS - 15 & MDS -19), the details of which are marked as **Annexure – A**.

After, deliberations, the Authority decides to approve admissions of Health Science Courses (UG & PG) for the Academic Year 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 on the basis of verification and observation reports of Directorate of Medical Education & Research, Mumbai. However the Directorate should sort out and dispose off with the discrepancies after appropriate compliances within two weeks from respective College/Institute. Office to inform accordingly.

#### Item No. 5:

To consider and decide on the letter dated 7<sup>th</sup> August 2017 received from Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik and representations received from Candidates/ Colleges regarding declaration of results of candidates including NRI candidates.

The Authority perused the aforesaid letter received from Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik along with representations received from Candidates/Colleges regarding declaration of results of candidates including NRI candidates.

The representative of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik pointed out that results of Summer Exam – 2017 to be declared around first week of September 2017 and last dates for submission of Examination form, for the students who failed in Summer Examination - 2017 are in and around  $2^{\rm nd}$  week of September 2017. Due to non availability of admissions approval report of the Authority, the University neither declared the results nor accepted the Examination forms of such students for next consequent Examinations of the Health Science Courses.

It is noticed that the most of the colleges has not submitted their admission details and admission approval proposals to the Admissions Regulating Authority.

In the light of above and in the interest of the students, the Authority directs the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik to declare the results of the students (except the students admitted in 15% NRI Quota) who appeared in Summer Examination - 2017 and accept the Examination forms of the students as per the norms. The Authority further directs the Secretary, Admissions Regulating Authority to issue the necessary instructions to the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik immediately. Office to take necessary steps.

The Authority also directed the University to give instructions to the colleges to submit the admission details/admission approval Proposal to the Director, Medical Education and Research for the verification report. After receipt of the verification report it may be placed before the Authority for its consideration. Office to inform accordingly.

Regarding declaration of result of NRI candidates, where all requisite documents so far have not been submitted by colleges to the Authority office, the request made by colleges running Health Science Courses, were taken into consideration, by the Authority and accordingly to avoid academic loss of such students, and in the interest of students the Authority after deliberations, directs to declare the result of the students admitted in Academic Year 2012-13 to 2016-17 in 15% NRI Quota, subject to submission of written undertaking by such

students to Authority office within two days mentioning that the requisite all documents w.r.t. NRI admissions will be submitted on or before 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2017 to the Authority office. However, result of NRI students, who have given final year Exam of Health Science Courses and also of Foreign National Students where admissions have not been approved by the Authority, will not be declared by the University. Office to issue letters to the University and all the Colleges/Institutes of Health Science Courses accordingly immediately and also to get details of NRI students i.e. name of student & course, Academic Year of admission, full address, Mobile/contact no., Email id etc. from the Colleges/Institutes. Office to do needful.

#### Item No. 6:

To consider and decide on the letter dated 18<sup>th</sup> July 2017 received from Dr. Hedgewar College of Nursing, Aurangabad requesting for approval of remaining 09 candidates out of 50 admitted in first year B.Sc. Nursing students for the Academic Year 2016-17 (Ref.: Minutes of meeting of Admissions Regulating Authority dated 04-05-2017

The Authority perused the aforesaid letter received from Dr. Hedgewar College of Nursing, Aurangabad requesting for approval of remaining 09 candidates out of 50 admitted in First Year B.Sc. Nursing students for the Academic Year 2016-17.

The Secretary, Admission Regulating Authority, Mumbai pointed out that on the basis of report of the Directorate of Medical Education and Research, Mumbai the Authority in its meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> May, 2017 approved the admissions of 41 students of Dr. Hedgewar College of Nursing, Aurangabad admitted in First Year B.Sc. Nursing course for the Academic Year 2016-17; subject to certain compliances.

The Officer on Special Duty of the Director, Medical Education and Research, Mumbai stated that he has received the list of only 41 students out of submission of admission details of 49 students of the aforesaid College/Institute and accordingly the Directorate submitted its verification report to the Authority.

In view of the above, after deliberations, the Authority directs the Dr. Hedgewar College of Nursing, Aurangabad to submit the detailed list of remaining 08 candidates admitted in First Year B.Sc. Nursing course for the Academic Year 2016-17 to the Directorate of Medical Education and Research and also to CET CELL and the Director, Directorate of Medical Education accordingly should submit his report within two weeks to the Authority. After receipt of the same it may be placed before the Authority for its consideration. Office to inform accordingly.

#### Item No. 7:

To consider and decide on the letter dated 12<sup>th</sup> July 2017 received from Supriyadidi Sule College of Nursing, Ahmednagar w.r.t. submission of compliance report as per the decision taken by the Authority in its meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> April 2017 regarding approval of admissions

The Authority directs the aforesaid College/Institute to submit the final judgment in the said matter to the Authority. After receipt of the same it may be placed before the Authority for its consideration. Office to inform accordingly.

#### Item No. 8:

The Secretary, Admission Regulating Authority, Mumbai pointed out that on the basis of report of the Directorate of AYUSH, Mumbai, the Authority in its meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> May, 2017 at item no. 5, has directed the Directorate, of AYUSH to rectify the discrepancies and accordingly the admission of Ku. Disha Jaiswal, was not approved as her SSC and HSC certificates are from outside Maharashtra, but admitted in 60% Quota (as per the remarks of the Directorate of AYUSH, Mumbai). The Secretary further added that aforesaid College/Institute in its letter dated 21/06/2017 has stated that Ku. Disha Jaiswal was admitted to the First Year BHMS course for the Academic Year 2016-17 as per the list of State CET-CELL and the admissions of the said College/Institute was verified by the Directorate of AYUSH, Mumbai before the cut-off-date.

In view of the above, after deliberations, the Authority directs the Directorate of AYUSH, Mumbai to verify the admission details of Ku. Disha Jaiswal and submit the report within two weeks to the Authority. After receipt of the same it may be placed before the Authority for its consideration. Office to inform accordingly.
